The start of February saw Mount Maunganui host the New Zealand Secondary Schools Beach Volleyball Championships with 226 teams entering this year.

2020 saw the introduction of a Year 9 tournament for Girls, which was won by Aliyah Rawle and Simonne Lawson (Carmel College) who beat Ani Doherty and Kendall McKane (Whakatane High School) in the final with Emma Searle and Tiani Rae (Otumoetai College).

Senior Girls saw Rose Akkerman and Larissa Meads (Otumoetai College) beat Kate Allan and Marijke Hinton (St Andrews College) in the final with Tatiyana Sorenson and Kayla Allison-Carnie (Long Bay College) finishing in third place.

Year 11 Girls was won by Rosa Vesty and Taylah Holdem (Burnside High School) who beat Grace Tiplady and Meile Rose Green (Taupo-nui-a tia) with Delphi Houlding and Rosie Larkin (Westlake Girls) finishing third.

Year 10 Girls was won by Kiana Stevenson and Kaia Buckley (Rangitoto College) who beat Hine Lankshear and Michelle Clarke (Tauranga Girls College) in the final with Mackenzie Melville and Alison Fan (Westlake Girls High School) coming in third place.

The Womens draw was won by Olivia McDonald and Antonia Harrison who beat Julia Tilley and Shaunna Polley with Ivey Schmitt and Sarah Seiber sharing third with Sonia Tompkins and Kaylie Loewen.

The tour then traveled south to Nelson for the first 5 Star event of the summer. Johann Timmer and Mike Watson defeated the Japanese Pair of Kensuke Shoji and Masato Kurasaka with David Jeffrey and Jack McManaway sharing third with Perry Preston and Giles Black.





Olivia MacDonald and Julia Tilley beat Ivey Schmitt and Sarah Seiber with Brittany Allison-Carnie and Renei Ursem finishing third alongside Sonia Tompkins and Kaylie Loewen.

Ruakaka was the next destination for the tour which doubled as the New Zealand Championships, meaning the highest placed New Zealand Pair would become the New Zealand Champions.

Alani Nicklin and Tom Hartles won the Mens title beating Johann Timmer and Mike Watson in a terrific final with Koichi Nishimura and Daisuke Shibata from Japan sharing third with Perry Preston and Giles Black.

Julia Tilley and Shaunna Polley won the Womens title beating Francesca Kirwan and Olivia MacDonald with Ivey Schmitt and Sarah Seiber sharing third with Renei Ursem and Tamara Otene.

Round 5 was back at Mount Maunganui for the second 5 star event, and, just like the first, Johann Timmer and Mike Watson won beating the European Pair of Gilbertas Kerpe and Tobias Helbig. Third place was split between David Jeffrey and Jack McManaway and Perry Preston and Giles Black.

Julia Tilley and Shaunna Polley won the Womens draw beating Francesca Kirwan and Olivia MacDonald with Ivey Schmitt and Sarah Seiber and Federica Tonon and Jennica McPherson coming third.

2020 ASIAN BEACH VOLLEYBALL CHAMPS

The 2020 Asian Beach Volleyball Champs took place last week in Thailand and we sent two teams over for the Mens draw. Alani Nicklin and Tom Hartles went straight into the main draw with Ben and Sam O'Dea having to go through qualifiers to make it into the main draw. Alani and Tom were given the 13th Seed which placed them in a pool with the number 4 seeds from Australia McHugh and Schumann. Ben and Sam were given the 23 seeds putting them in a pool with the number 7 and 10 seeds.


The first game in the main draw for New Zealand saw the O'Dea's battle hard but ultimately lose in 3 to Thailand. Tom and Alani also saw a first game defeat to Iran in 2, however, the afternoon seemed to bring about a change in fortunes for both teams. Ben and Sam beat a strong Iranian side in 3 and Tom and Alani swept aside Taipei in 2 leaving both teams with a chance of qualifying for the knockout stages.

The second day saw Tom and Alani match up against Australia and despite a brilliant fight, they lost in 2 ending their chances of progressing to the Knockout stages. The O'Deas however rose to the pressure and beat Kazakhstan in 2 to set up and knockout match against Japan late that day. After an hour long battle in the Afternoon Sun, Japan won the game in three sets leaving Ben and Sam in equal 9th Place and Tom and Alani equal 17th Place.


